BALID EC Meeting held



Bangabandhu Boi Mela held in London

With the motto 'Know Bangabandhu, Love Bangladesh' a daylong Bangabandhu Boi Mela (Bangabandhu Book Fair) was held in London for the fifth time on March 18. The event was held in East London's Brady Arts and Community Centre. The fair was inaugurated by Minister of Cultural Affairs Asaduzzaman Noor. He was present as the chief guest in the programme.

The European College of Law organised the fair. London Centre for Bangladesh Studies and Bangabandhu Centre London were associate organisers. The fair was planned and sponsored in collaboration with the Ministry of Cultural Affairs, Bangladesh. According to the organisers, the book fair will contribute to educating Bangladeshis who grow up in the UK. They will be encouraged to know the history of Bangladesh and will learn a lot about Bangabandhu- the Father of the Nation through this fair.

The fair was directed by Bulbul Hasan. Prashanta B Barua- one of the sponsors of the fair, president of UK Awami League Sultan Sharif, among others, spoke at the inaugural ceremony.

Asaduzzaman Noor said, "Those who debate on the declaration of independence, they are living in the world of a fool." People from Northern Part of the country did not hear Kalurghat Radio Station's declaration of weak frequency. We did not hear the declaration of Kalurghat.' He was present at historical Race Course Maidan on March 7 in 1971 to hear Bangabandhu's speech, he added. He was then a member of left-wing political parties. The speech inspired him in the quest for freedom. On March 14 they seized a police station and got training on March 15 accordingly. 'We did not hear neither Belal Bhai's declaration nor Mr Hannan's speech. We did not even hear Ziaur Rahman's declaration. Because we heard the 7th March

Speech and it was playing in our ears. Everything happened before March 25, the minister added. He also criticised BNP supporters of UK to humiliated Bangabandhu's photo. He said we may have the different ideology or political differences, it is obvious that in a democratic country must have different political parties but we should respect our father of the nation. Bangabandhu is our spirit and our inspiration. In order to move our country one step forward, we have to

work by taking inspiration from his works, the minister added.

Around one thousand and five hundred books on the topic of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and Bangladesh were stocked in the fair. The fair aims to shed light on the illustrious life and works of Bangabandhu. People from different places of Great Britain gathered at the event. They also enjoyed a poetry recitation and cultural evening as well as an art competition for children.

Prominent journalist and columnist Abdul Gaffar Chowdhury presided over the programme. Director General of Bangla Academy Shamsuzzaman Khan, famous educationist Professor Dr Syed Manzoorul Islam and High Commissioner of Bangladesh to the United Kingdom MD. Nazmul Quaunine were present as special guests.

It is thought that the school librar-

ies may play an active dynamic role to gear up public libraries. On the other hand public libraries would find better readership and better environment if school students frequently visit public libraries. This Seminar was highlighted the possible high ways and byways of the reciprocation between school libraries and public libraries for better sustenance of both systems. It tries to find out possible avenues to overcome such critical situation. Mr Prodip Roy, (Editor of TLT) participated in the event as an invited speaker to talk about RMIT University Library's current Digital Transition project. His presentation mainly focused on the major challenges the Alma D team has been facing as an early adoption partner of Ex Libris and tips on the migration of metadata to a new system.

Mr Roy also had an opportunity to participate in other sessions including an interactive discussion panel and listened to some great practical examples

of how institutions can respond to the challenges of digital preservation. There were also opportunities during the sessions to ask questions about issues that are relevant to our Alma D project. Finally, the conference provided details from real-life digitisation case studies from participant organisations like the National Archives of Australia, University of Melbourne and Public Record Office Victoria.

The presentation was scored 5.6 out of 7 by the audiences.

Releasing 1.8 million open access publications from publisher systems for text and data mining

Text and data mining offers an opportunity to improve the way we access and analyse the outputs of academic research. But the technical infrastructure of the current scholarly communication system is not yet ready to support TDM to its full potential, even for open access outputs. To address this problem, **Petr Knoth**, **Nancy Pontika** and **Lucas Anastasiou** have developed the CORE Publisher Connector, a toolkit service designed to assist text miners in accessing content though a single machine interface.

Women earn 6.2% less than men per hour at the British Library, it has been revealed.

The institution has submitted its gender pay gap data to the government ahead of the April 2018 deadline, showing that men are paid a mean average of £16.75 an hour across the organisation's staff, while women earn £15.72 – a gap of 6.2%.
