Movement leaders of Bangladesh:


Libraries Unlimited project consultants Mr. John Dolan and Ayub Khan, came across the library executive board members of Bangladesh Association of Librarians,

The session was emphasized around modern skills, their change programme, international library associations like CILIP and its activities.

It was a very lively session; Library movement activists of Bangladesh shared different ideas to Mr. Donald and Mr. Khan and appreciated their role. Ms. Sarwat Reza, Library Manager, British Council, Dhaka conducted the programme.

The British Council, in partnership with the Government of Bangladesh, is implementing a nationwide project titled Libraries Unlimited that is aimed to develop the library sector in Bangladesh. The project is funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

Libraries Unlimited aims to greatly improve the lives of the citizens of Bangladesh through the creation of new innovative models of libraries. These libraries will provide free access to information, resources and the internet with a particular focus on reaching women, young people 'not in education, regular employment or training' (NEETs) and micro-entrepreneurs.



IFLA Library Map of the World is a representative source of basic library statistics and a robust tool for providing a world-wide comparison of different library performance metrics, mapped by country level data.

In March 2017, IFLA launched the Library Map of the World 2017 Survey to collect a basic set of library performance metrics from as many countries as possible and to make a visualisation of the data for all to use. The data visualisation website will be launched at IFLA WLIC 2017 in Wrocław, Poland in August 2017.

How you can act now to preserve funding

On March 16, President Trump submitted his budget outline—the so-called skinny budget—to Congress, which proposes wholesale changes to federal funding priorities, including deep cuts to many programs. Alarmingly to librarians across the nation, those proposals include eliminating the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and more than \$210 million in funding cuts for the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) and Innovative Approaches to Literacy (IAL) programs.
