ProQuest and CALIS Bring Chinese Scholarship to a Global Audience

ProQuest and China Academic Library Information System (CALIS), a consortium of Chinese higher education libraries, have expanded their long-standing collaboration and are now enabling unprecedented, global access to more than 270,000 dissertation abstracts from China's premier universities. The records, captured in English, are available in the ProQuest Dissertations & Theses Global Database (PQDT Global™), allowing 3,000 universities around the world to discover graduate research from institutions in China. This is the second major dissertations project from ProQuest and CALIS, who have worked together for more than a decade. In 2003, they created a dissertations resource that empowers CALIS member libraries to discover and access the full text of more than 630,000 dissertations from PQDT Global on the CALIS platform.
