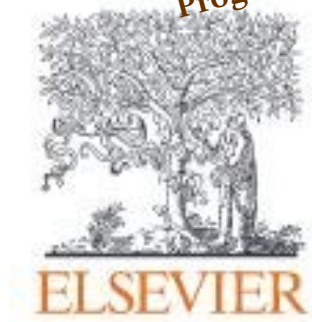

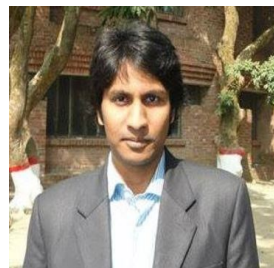


Till today, so far two library professionals have been successfully completed the 2017 Mendeley certification program from Bangladesh.

Head of Moscow's Ukrainian library convicted of incitement against Russians, By Andrew Osborn | MOSCOW

The head of Russia's only state-run Ukrainian library was convicted on Monday of inciting hatred against Russians in a case that she compared to a Stalin-era political show trial. Armed, masked police arrested Natalya Sharina in October 2015, confiscating books that the authorities called illegal anti-Russian propaganda. Sharina, 59, has been held under house arrest and has always denied wrongdoing.
