A Grand Efficacious ISLM Re-Union 2017 Held at University of Dhaka

Rajesh Kumar Das has just kicked off his voyage as a Lecturer at the Institute of Information Sciences in Noakhali Science and Technology University, Bangladesh (NSTUB). Rajesh obtained his B.A. and M.A. degrees in Information Science and Library Management from the University of Dhaka. He secured 1st position in his master's and currently studies MPhil at the same university. Earlier, Rajesh served in various positions at Bengal Foundation, Royal University of Dhaka and Institute of Library and Information Science Dhaka.

Rajesh, a person passionate about research and delights in experimenting digital library, bibliometrics, scientometrics, knowledge management, information behaviour and its related phenomena. He has been invited as a speaker at the international conferences such as the International Research Conference held in the University of Mumbai. He has also published a good number of articles in renowned peer-reviewed journals including the Journal of Information Science Theory and Practice. He authored a book on citation analysis that focused on the bibliometric aspect and collection development. Recent major research projects initiated by Rajesh are (1) pedagogical approaches to teaching and learning librarianship (2) open access publishing trends in Bangladesh and (3) application of data mining in digital libraries.
