A group of library professionals from Bangladesh has attended the Asian Regional Meeting 2017: Open in Action: Reaching The Information Divide. This event was scheduled on 2-3 December 2017, at Hotel Annapurna in Kathmandu, Nepal.

Mr. Konok Monirul Islam, Convenor OAB and Librarian, Prime Minister's Office, was selected as one of the panel discussion members to talk on Open "Access Bangladesh, achievements and challenges faced" for day one.

The community is dedicated to people working in the academic environment based in the Asian region and it celebrates Asian cultural diversity and unique way of doing things. Each year, OA Asia organizes a meeting to

bring people from the Asian region together and help build capacity in one country.

This year, the Asia OA meeting took place in Kathmandu, Nepal. The meeting provides participants with an opportunity to learn about global trends, share information across Asian countries, and help with local strategies for increasing the adoption of OA in Nepal.
