Policy dialogue titled Libraries Unlimited: Transform libraries, transform lives; held at British Council, Dhaka on 23-24 January, 2018

The British Council, in collaboration with the Ministry of Cultural Affairs, with the support of the Department of Public libraries, is implementing a nationwide project titled 'Libraries Unlimited' to develop the library sector in Bangladesh. A two-day long policy dialogue started at the British Council premises at Fuller Road from January 23, 2018.

Ashish Kumar Sarker, Director General of Department of Public Libraries inaugurated the opening session along with Barbara Wickham, Country Director, British Council. Kirsty Crawford, Project

Director- Libraries Unlimited, British Council and Sarwat Reza, Head of Cultural Centre, British Council, were also present at the session.

Institute of Informatics and Development (IID) is a policy partner for this project. Based on the nationwide study, Library Landscape Assessment in Bangladesh, Libraries Unlimited seeks to improve public access to information and knowledge in Bangladesh.

As part of the project's policy and advocacy strand, British Council with IID as its policy partner will support relevant ministries to develop a shared vision of 21st century libraries across

Bangladesh that embeds the country's commitment to the Sustainable Development Goals and provide communities with access to information, knowledge and skills development.

In order to create a shared vision of 21st century libraries, the purpose of this policy dialogue, titled, 'Libraries Unlimited: Transform libraries, transform lives', brought together top level policy makers and thinkers to have a dialogue around prioritising services for public libraries and how to transform these libraries to make them more equipped to meet today's demand for information and knowledge.



43% of all librarians believe insufficient ICT facilities would be a “major challenge”.

This is the final phase of the series of consultation with various stakeholders to develop a Vision Document for the Government of Bangladesh that will include recommended service suite along, with necessary policy recommendation for more modern public libraries in context of Bangladesh. The British Council conducted a study, which found that most public libraries in Bangladesh are in a terrible condition as they lack both printed and digital resources. The “Library Landscape Assessment of Bangladesh” released a report on Wednesday that reveals over half (52%) of all librarians think they are lacking printed materials; while almost four out of every five (78%) are

dissatisfied with the lack of digital resources. The report was based on an assessment of 136 public libraries at the district and upazila levels and found that 43% of all librarians believe insufficient ICT facilities would be a “major challenge”. The key findings were presented on the final day of a two-day policy dialogue in Dhaka Wednesday by Syeed Ahmed, CEO of the Institute of Informatics and Development (IID). “When the country is advancing towards achieving the vision of ‘Digital Bangladesh’, the libraries – the heart of the informative society – have somehow been excluded from the development plan,” he noted.

British Council with IID as its policy partner will support relevant ministries to develop a shared vision of 21st century libraries across Bangladesh that embeds the country’s commitment to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and provide communities with access to information, knowledge and skills development.

The policy dialogue was initiated to bring together top level policy makers

and thinkers around the need to prioritise services for public libraries, and ways to transform these libraries to make them more equipped to meet today’s demand for information and knowledge.

Speakers and participants at the policy dialogue discussed a wide array of issues including, library activities, information marketing and best possible practices for the libraries in the coun-

try, along with the focal points for formulating the country’s first ever library policy.

Sarwat Masuda Reza, library manager of British Council, Bangladesh, said the recommendations from the policy dialogue would be presented to the ministries concerned before National Library Day on February 5.

In the last issue at part two, we discussed and analysed individual vote received, unused votes, won by vote differences etc. Today we will be focusing on other statistics on election result and rules (which was circulated by the office of Chief Election Officer).

Received highest votes:

- ADM Ali Ahmed-Vice President Candidate-1219 votes
- Syeda Farida Parvin-Councilor(Central) Candidate-1219 votes
- Md. Emdadul Haque-Research and Publication Secretary Candidate-1218 votes

03. Voters will be identified by their photo and mobile numbers from the voters list. If there is no photograph and mobile number, then NID should show of a particular voter during vote.

04. Voters who is listed of a particular division would eligible to vote in that particular division only. One divisional voter is not eligible to cast vote to another division. As per LAB constitution, sub section 13, to form divisional Executive council; voter should be the that particular division only.

05. LAB election 2017 may be done with a panel or individual. If divisional councilor included central position, they may not participate others position at division level

06. Candidates should not discuss with others of any negative information against the opponent.

07. In LAB election, no one is allowed to focus on their personal political identity and use photograph of a political leader, political slogan, and religious matter.

08. No one can set up election campaign/office within 50 yards of the vote centre.

09. Chief Election Officer will discuss Central and Divisional candidate if required. He may include anything which are not contradictory with LAB Constitution

10. To participate in the election, everyone has to abide by the Constitution of the Association

11. If anyone violate of the above etiquette, Divisional Election Officer will cancel candidature of particular candidate by consulting with the Chief Election Officer.
