ULAB Observed World Book Day on 23 April 2018



The library is not a selling centre: An opinion

Since my boyhood, I have compared the library to a Mandir (Hindu Temple). I used to think that these two (Temple and library) are the kinds of places wherein we should keep quiet and avoid gossiping. We should visit these places after having a bath and wearing clean clothes. Still, I compare a library with a Mandir from core of my heart. But I do feel ashamed when I see a lot of libraries here and there in the city, selling stationeries and books as well. And even an educated people to treat these shops as the library.

Commonly, these libraries sell educational materials like books, notebooks, pens, pencils, sharpeners, toys etc. They even sell cigarettes! This is a typical scenario in Bangladesh. One can easily find these so-called libraries around the educational institutions, from kindergartens to universities. Every city of Bangladesh has more than one such kind of libraries. There are also newspaper hawkers' stand namely 'Newspaper Selling Center or Library'. These libraries open every morning and typically close at midnight. Sometimes the librarian (!) tries to motivate a customer for buying products. In this library, most of the time librarian is very busy in gossiping or reading newspaper. The person has several obedient personnels who strictly follow his directions. Sometimes they ask the librarian, 'Sir, he/she (the customer) wants to buy it (product) at ten takas'. The librarian (!) whimsically replies, 'give it'.

These are merely bookshops, nothing else. Unfortunately, these business shops are named as the library.

Who started this idea, God knows! Here, I would like to mention a conversation between me and one of my colleagues who is a prominent journalist of one of the best daily newspapers in the country. One day he said, I bought some books from Sabuj Library at Shantibag. I added do you buy cigarettes from there? He amusingly replied that library sells educational materials. I tried a lot to make him understand that, this is not a library and we can simply say bookshop. But my words just amused him. He was kidding with me - I remembered those days of bullying 'ALMIRAH SCIENCE' that day.

The conversation was happened in 2011. But the situation and attitude are still remaining the same. No changes at all. They are doing business, its ok. But the name of their shop must be changed.

When a journalist treated a library to a bookshop, we should feel pity. What about the school going children? What thinking about they bookstores? They are growing up with some wrong conceptions. As a result, a vast number of people have no clear idea about the library.

What about the cyber world of Bangladesh? I have found several well managed fan pages on Facebook namely '... Library', such as Dynamic Library' etc. At the website they mention, 'book & magazine distributor in Kakrail, Dhaka, Bangladesh'. These are mainly E-commerce sites which selling books, computers, smartphones, smartwatches and other accessories. But they put the word 'library'. And some library professionals who graduated in Information Science and Library Management also follow these types of pages. I

guess there are many sites which named under the library.

A couple of years ago, I wanted to capture these shops' photos and would like to share these to the library community. That is another story.

Now I would like to talk regarding this issue. How can we cope with this social national problem? Is it our failure? Have we failed to educate even the educated class like the journo? We should raise our voice to aware the mass people. We should also try to change their conceptions about the library. Otherwise, I will fail to compare the library to a Mandir.
